



Progress towards several of the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals, including eliminating poverty and reducing inequalities, requires teams of fit-for-purpose health and social service providers working where they are most needed and accountable to the populations they serve. Students are the cardinal component of producing the committed and socially accountable health workforce and the future leaders in the health system.

Their dynamic and goal oriented strategies are the key to framing and strengthening the health system, reducing inequities and providing quality care to the community. They need to be equipped with the skills and tools to tackle the challenges, lead teams of people, promote community

engagement, inspire and facilitate the conditions that enable them to be the best in the pursuit of shared goals.

The Pre Conference Workshop with the training session from the Training for Health Equity Network (THEnet) is based on an operational model for social accountability that outlines the guiding principles and values of social accountability. It includes an introduction to a Framework for Socially Accountable Health Workforce Education and the elucidation of how to actively engage and involve the stakeholders including those on the margins in the decision-making process. This should be a stimulating experience for the community of young change makers.
