## Michael Long Learning and Leadership Centre



Officially opened on the 13th March 2015 the Michael Long Learning and Leadership Centre (MLLLC) is designed to harness the power of Australian Football League (AFL) in the Northern Territory (NT) to give young Indigenous Territorians the same opportunities as their non-Indigenous peers.

The centre has a focus well beyond football delivering education programs for indigenous students from remote areas. These programs weave the innate indigenous connection to football with education outcomes, a need to cultivate a passion for pursing and education in alignment with personal and cultural dreams.

Since the establish of the MLLLC in 2015, more than 700 students have participated in our programs. The MLLLC Education Program encompasses 15 weeks of community-based education and leadership lessons and a one-week education residential program at the MLLLC. AFLNT's team of Remote Development Managers support the delivery of the community-based elements of these programs.

On site will be some Indigenous students from Maningrida and Tiwi Islands, conference delegates will have the opportunity to speak with them, if they aren't too shy! And then have a tour of the centre's facilities, gaining an understanding of the opportunities the MLLLC is providing these children.
