Danila Dilba Health Service



Danila Dilba Health Service is an Aboriginal community-controlled organisation providing culturally-appropriate, comprehensive primary health care and community services to Biluru (Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander) people in the Yilli Rreung (greater Darwin) region of the Northern Territory.

Danila Dilba's mission is: "to improve the physical, mental, spiritual, cultural and social well-being of the Biluru community of the Yilli Rreung Region through innovative comprehensive primary health care programs, community services and advocacy that are based on the principles of equity, access, empowerment, community self-determination and collaboration".

DDHS is Darwin's only Aboriginal community-controlled health service, with seven clinics in the region catering to the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander population. Health care services provided by DDHS are focused on acute care, immunisation, chronic disease management, women's health, men's health, child and maternal health, sexual health and social emotional wellbeing DDHS also provides a range of community programs in areas including health promotion, mental health/social and emotional wellbeing, and alcohol, tobacco and other drugs.

DDHS has 4 clinics in Darwin/ Palmerston areas; Bagot Clinic, Darwin Clinic, Gumileybirra (Palmerston), Malak Clinic, Men's Clinic, Palmerson Clinic and Rapid Creek Clinic. Delegates will meet at Binyolkga House for an over view and then be taken on a tour of the Darwin Clinic on Knuckey St.

Museum and Art Gallery NT

The Museum and Art Gallery of the Northern Territory (MAGNT) is the Northern Territory's premier cultural organisation.

Set in a scenic location overlooking the Arafura Sea in Darwin, MAGNT is home to internationally renowned artistic, cultural and scientific collections and research programs.

Each year MAGNT presents a dynamic program of internally-developed exhibitions, carefully curated from the collection, and the best travelling exhibitions from around Australia.

It is also the home of the annual <u>Telstra National Aboriginal and Torres Strait</u> <u>Islander Art Awards (NATSIAA)</u>- the most significant celebration of its kind in Australia, this exhibition is currently on and showcasing the very best Australian Indigenous art from around the country.

Delegates will have free time to wander around the Museum immersing oneself in exhibitions of interest, whether it be the 36th Telstra NATSIAA, Between the Moon and the Stars- where Science and art come together to reveal the influence of the stars, the Moon and its phases, the cyclone Tracey exhibition or see MAGNT's most famous resident, "Sweetheart the crocodile".
